Introduction to our Committee

Tony Marsh (Administration/Website)

Hello KCLG Landcarer's I've been a Baranduda Landcare member for 20 years or more and have lived here for 42 years so I guess I must love the place. My background is in Ag Science initially and then Info Tech after returning to study in 1990 and I spent the last 11 years of my working life teaching Info Tech at Latrobe and then CSU. I'm a proud member and president of Baranduda Landcare working with our powerhouse secretary Glen Johnson. We have achieved some fantastic outcomes especially via our annual Planet Ark activities – this year will be the 21st. Most recently we've worked on approximately 10km of the Middle Creek removing aggressive willow species and restoring indigenous vegetation. Blackberry control has been carried out Parklands Baranduda which is a 420 Ha reserve to the north of Baranduda Regional Park and several km of key roadside vegetation protected and enhanced. We have also received funding for management of Yackandandah Creek.

My role on the KCLG committee relates primarily to website, membership, technical issues and supporting funding applications. I do love to participate in field days and manage an extensive garden at home which is looking splendid after 2 fantastic seasons.

I firmly believe that as active Landcarers we can help make a difference especially with the biggest threat we are facing - global warming.




What's coming up in our region

Kiewa Carbon Bash - Soil Carbon Field Days 24th and 25th February

KCLG in partnership with David Hardwick from SoilLandFood are holding our next series of workshops on Soil Carbon in two weeks on the 24th and 25th February. Everyone is welcome to this free event, see our poster below for details.

Join us over one or two days, visiting our four trial properties for the first of three on-farm field days looking at all things soil carbon.

- Learn about the Demo sites and the Carbon Farming activities we are trialling including: multi-species pastures, using gypsum, compost or biological products, using a Yeomens keyline plow and rotational grazing.
- Explore what farm practices can help build soil carbon in the Kiewa Valley.
- Learn how sampling for soil carbon happens under a Carbon Project.
- Learn about how we are sampling soil health on the farms.
 - See a soil corer in action.

Bring your soil carbon and soil health questions along to the day as we will have a range of specialists on hand - Including our mentor for this project, agroecologist **David Hardwick (Soil Land Food)**, **Dr Greg Bender (Australian Soil Managament & Nick McGrath (McGrath Soils)**

This is a free event with catered lunch by Waddingtons at Kergunyah, which will be supplied on farm in-between the morning and afternoon sessions.


