Yackandandah Landcare Update

The Yackandandah Landcare Group has a busy year ahead with three newly funded projects to get involved with! Below is an update from the group on all activities being undertaken and how you can get involved.

Junior Landcare Grant - Yackandandah Primary School

A Junior Landcare grant was awarded to Yackandandah Primary School in learning about flora, fauna, invertebrates and pollinators, and aquatic life. A tree planting will be held out the back of Yack Health on Thursday 23 June by students and residents. Feel free to come along and lend a hand (see below for further contact details).

Wetlands Project

A local wetlands project funded by The Ross Trust aims to involve the Yackandandah community in learning about our two wonderful wetlands within the town. The wetlands at the Sports Park were renovated in 2016 and a successful tree planting by scouts and local families has created a beautiful space for wildlife (see photos below). The wetland now has a bench seat and is a peaceful spot to take a walk and rest. The residents of Yack Health and Yackatoon will be invited to join a community walk around the wetland in spring. Primary school students will be doing wetland health surveys to measure water quality, discover invertebrates, identify vegetation and birdlife. The second man-made wetland on Bells Flat Rd will also be used as a study site to compare features of a natural versus artificial wetland.

Rowdy Flat Project

We are offering free native plants to residents and landholders within the Kiewa, Tangambalanga, and Bonegilla areas. We are looking to engage new people into Landcare and increase the amount of native vegetation to improve biodiversity across our urban and rural properties.

So how does it work?

- Orders open Friday 10th June and close Thursday 14th July (or until stocks last)
- Limit of one order per household/property
- Orders are open to all residents within the Kiewa-Tangambalanga-Bonegilla Landcare area, both urban and rural.
- Landholders/residents are entitled up to 10 plants, paid Landcare members are entitled up to 30 free plants (to become a member visit www.kclg.org.au \$25/year).
- Orders will be available from the week on July 19th in a central pick-up location in Tangambalanga.

Would you like to access subsided soil testing? Expressions of interest are now open for the Australian Governments Pilot Soils Monitoring and Testing Program

The Australian Government is providing \$54.4 million over two years to support farmers and land managers to access low-cost soil sampling and certified testing in exchange for sharing their data under the Pilot Soil Monitoring and Incentives Program.

Farmers and land managers may be eligible for benefits of up to \$10,000 and receive assistance from Commonwealth-funded soil extension officers to interpret their soil test results. Southern Cross University has been engaged to deliver the program, including arranging soil sampling and testing for land managers who have successfully applied for assistance.

Have your say on the management of the Lower Kiewa catchment - closes 15th June 2022

The Kiewa River is a major river system in north east Victoria and features many important places, valued for their natural and agricultural landscapes. The Lower Kiewa catchment area includes a wide range of farming, urban, and natural landscapes from Gundowring downstream to the junction of the Kiewa and Murray Rivers, including Yackandandah and Middle Creek sub-catchments. The Country of the Lower Kiewa catchment is also important to its Traditional Owners and First Nations Peoples, and is rich in cultural heritage.

Stewardship Action Plan for the Lower Kiewa

An Action Plan is being prepared to guide management of land, water and biodiversity values in the Lower Kiewa catchment. This is an opportunity to support the community to connect and collaborate in catchment stewardship. The North East Catchment Management Authority (CMA) is seeking input from a broader group of stakeholders, government and non-government organisations and the community to understand their issues, challenges and aspirations for the catchment.
